THINK

"Like slavery and apartheid, poverty is not natural. It is man-made and it can be overcome and eradicated by the actions of human beings. Sometimes it falls on a generation to be great."

FEEL

Activity: Think Puzzle Explore

What do you **think** you know about this topic?

What questions or **puzzles** do you have?

How can you **explore** this topic?

Ask students to choose a way they would like to show their understanding- a poster, keynote, poem, quiz etc.

ACT:

- Donate what you don't use. Local charities will give your gently used clothes, books and furniture a new life.
- Support campaigns collecting items for victims of emergencies. Donate your clothes, food supplies etc. to support those in need.
